### NY Governor: Boost Renewable Energy and Energy Efficiency Goal

In his first State of the State address on January 7, New York Governor David Paterson called for a clean energy plan that requires 45 percent of New York State's electricity needs be met through improved energy efficiency and greater use of renewable energy by 2015. The state's current renewable portfolio standard is 25 percent by 2013. The "45 by 15" standard, he said, will also create 50,000 new jobs for the state's displaced and unemployed workers and establish a workforce for a clean energy economy.

The new goal would dovetail with the state's efforts to reduce emissions. New York is a charter member of the Regional Greenhouse Gas Initiative http://www.rggi.org/home) and is participating in the nation's first carbon cap-and-trade effort.
