President Better Building Initiative Announced

he President announced a "Better Buildings Initiative" that will aspire to make commercial buildings 20% more energy efficient. The projected energy bill savings could be around \$40 billion at current utility rates. The government will offer incentives for offices, schools, universities and hospitals to upgrade to more energy efficient practices. These incentives, pending budget approval, include new tax incentives for building efficiency, financing opportunities, and loan opportunities.

Another part of this plan for state government and municipal will include fast tracked regulations and attract private investment for building retrofit renovations, grants for local government that streamline standards, challenges to CEOs and university presidents to encourage their organization leaders to save energy, and training for future commercial building technology workers. A statement released by The White House indicated that the Better Building Initiative will complement programs that are currently in place for residential and government buildings (The American Recovery and Reinvestment Act).
