CLAY D. SMITH

Last month I wrote an obit on Clay that covered most of the high points of his very significant life

and career. On Sunday November 4th I attended a memorial service that really brought out so much more about him. It was held in the large dining room of the Orchard Vali Golf Club down on Route 20 in apple country, which was filled to capacity with over 150 people. For well over two hours, family and friends from all walks of his life illustrious life went to the microphone giving three to five minute remembrances, stories and accolades about him. I heard and saw those that knew him and were with him in the many pursuits in which he was involved. I have to believe that of all the memorial services I have attended in my many years, this was the most outstanding. An engineer that worked with him at Bristol-Myers recounted the story about how Clay was instrumental in bringing standardization to the pharmaceutical industry during his five-year career there. Several spoke about the article and picture of him in Time magazine 25 years ago when he was involved with developing a coal/water slurry alternative fuel at Otisca Industries. A Town of Lafayette Highway Department mechanic spoke admiringly of him, having known Clay during Clay's five year term as Town of Lafayette Supervisor. I don't have their names, but we heard first hand from so many that knew and admired him. He touched many lives in his time and I think he must have become a friend of just about everyone of them.

This month's speaker is Jim O'Hara with Clearwater Systems. Jim is a graduate of Dowling University in Oakdale, NY. Jim was employed with Johnson Diversey (formerly S. C. The technology discussed will focus on Pulse Power. Pulse power water treatment is used to eliminate scaling, control and inhibit bacteria growth and corrosion in the system.

ASHRAE Washington Office and the Advocacy Committee

Over the past couple of years, ASHRAE has reorganized its Washington Office and established an Advocacy Committee to guide the activity of the Government Affairs Staff in the Washington office. Following is a brief overview of ASHRAE's activities related to government affairs. I will provide updates on the activity of the Washington Office and the Advocacy Committee in future newsletters.

ASHRAE Government Affairs staff regularly tracks activities within Congress and Federal agencies that are of importance to ASHRAE members. When warranted, letters and testimony are prepared to express ASHRAE's stance on a particular issue. The most recent letters or testimony can be found on their web site at http://www.ashrae.org/advocacy/page/1348. Previous letters and testimony are available in the http://www.ashrae.org/advocacy/page/1228 "Letters and Testimony" archives.

The Advocacy Committee is chaired by the President-Elect and currently has 9 members representing the various interest groups within the ASHRAE Membership. The committee is responsible for developing the extent and the manner in which ASHRAE implements and pursues actions to influence government policy. The Advocacy Committees meets in person twice a year, during the Winter and Annual meeting, and holds frequent conference calls to discuss relevant government activity.

To connect ASHRAE members with activities within Congress and Federal agencies, the Washington office has developed biweekly Government Affairs Updates. The most recent update can be found at

http://www.ashrae.org/advocacy/page/1344. If interested, you can sign up to receive the updates by email.

ASHRAE members have numerous opportunities to engage in public policy activities including the ASHRAE Washington Fellowship; the Washington Internship for Students of Engineering (WISE) program; the Science, Engineering and Technology (SET) Working Group Congressional Visits Days; and ASHRAE Capitol Hill Briefings. In an effort to translate ASHRAE's positions and activities into easily understood and communicated concepts, the Washington office, with input from ASHRAE's advocacy committee, has developed a series of issue briefs. 
